Barham Park update

Construction work is now well underway on both construction sites.



Phase 1A on site

At the Maybank end of Barham Park, fifty one new rented homes are being constructed, and these should be ready for occupation in the summer of 2012.

A further block of existing flats at the Maybank end of Saunderton Road will be demolished in the next couple of months to allow construction to start on another eleven rented homes.

These will be completed towards the end of 2012.

Your Council and Notting Hill Housing officers are working closely with personnel from Countryside Properties to ensure the construction work being undertaken by their various operatives and sub-contractors does not cause too much disruption to life at Barham Park.

Of course - as with all large construction projects - things will go wrong from time to time, and what's important is that they are put right as quickly as possible. Monthly meetings with the Residents' Association are very helpful in the process of monitoring progress and problems to try to ensure the works run as smoothly as possible.

Danger Warning

At the entrance to Roundtree Road you will have seen the new temporary road. This is strictly for cars and lorries only. Please make sure that you and your family avoid walking along this road. There is no footpath and it is not designed for pedestrian use. There is an alternative footpath that is signposted alongside the electricity substation, which leads from block 1-7 Saunderton Road up to block 37-41. Please use this footpath for your own safety.
